Lobby Day Focus: **IMPACT ACT** The Improved Nutrition and Physical Activity Act, H.R. 5698, S. 1325

Grants for training for health profession students to include the treatment of overweight, obesity, and eating disorders.

Grants for the training of eating disorders and obesity for physicians and other health professions.

Grants for programs that promote healthy eating & physical activity.

Data collection for determining the fitness levels and energy expenditures of children.

Research on health disparities.

Permits states to use preventive health and health services block grants for activities and community education programs designed to address and prevent obesity and eating disorders.

Report to Congress on overweight, obesity, & eating disorder and on effective campaigns change children's behaviors and reduce obesity.
